We Gather to Worship God

LIFE OF THE CONGREGATION

* CALL TO WORSHIP from Psalm 8 God calls us into His presence to connect with Him in worship.

Leader: O LORD, our Lord, How majestic is your name in all the earth!

People: You have set your glory above the heavens. When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, what is man that you are mindful of him? Leader: Yet you crowned him with glory and honor People: O LORD, our Lord, How majestic is your name in all the earth!

* OPENING PRAYER

We respond to God's gracious invitation by asking Him to empower and receive our worship

* SONG OF PRAISE

God's people have always worshiped Him in song, and we join our voices with theirs to give Him praise as our Creator and Redeemer.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION

As we come into God's presence, we see ourselves as we are and at his invitation, we confess our sins individually and together.

(Unison) "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens." Your creation is beautiful and testifies to your glory. You have crowned men and women with glory and honor and given them dominion over the earth. Yet, sin has marred your image in us, and we confess that we have elevated the things of this world above you. We have made idols of possessions and people. We have not given praise where praise was due. Forgive us, Father, for not loving you with our whole heart and mind and strength not loving our neighbors as ourselves. Grant us now, the grace to die daily to sin, and to rise daily to new life in Christ, who lives and reigns with you, and in whose strong name we pray. (Silent Confession) Amen.

ASSURANCE OF PARDONING GRACE Jeremiah 33:8 God declares that all who repent and believe in Jesus Christ are completely forgiven from the guilt and shame of all their sins.

I will cleanse them from all the guilt of their sin against me, and I will forgive all the guilt of their sin and rebellion against me.

GIVING OF TITHES AND OFFERINGS

In gratitude to God, we give back a portion of what he has entrusted to us for the work of His kingdom.

* DOXOLOGY

We celebrate what God has done, giving Him all the credit for it.

THE PRAYERS OF GOD'S PEOPLE

We express our hearts to God on behalf of God's people for grace and mercy especially for the hurting, needy, and broken.

(Unison) Our Father Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

Reflections on Psalm 8

Creation and Redemption Are Drawn Together in This Psalm: This psalm gives thanks to God for two excellent benefits bestowed on humankind: creation in Adam and restoration in Christ. Although that man, Adam, by his own fault tarnished that preeminence in which he was created, still vestiges of that dignity survive. In that he is preeminent over all beasts and has a certain power of life and death over them, and also in that special providence by which God embraces humankind. But in that second state. the eternal Son of God has exalted human nature-having been assumed in the unity of his person—after all human infirmity had been laid on him, so that he would make all believers partakers of his dignity. To them alone he grants that in this life they should have the light of true wisdom and that they may enjoy all created things in this world with good conscience. That is the true goal of this psalm, as interpreted by the Holy Spirit himself.
